- DEF specialises in **identifying the local projects** that are best-placed to restore nature on the ground in the place they love.
- We fill a funding gap for smaller or pioneering projects that require flexible funding, providing vital kick-start or scale-up support.
- We are independent and agile, directing funds where they are needed quickly to deliver the greatest benefits for nature.
- Our Advisory Board of **leading local nature experts** helps optimise our grant-making process.
- We showcase project successes, share best practice, and enable collaboration and replication to amplify impact.
- In our first 4.5 years, we have supported **81 local grassroots** projects awarding more than £1 million.

OUR PROJECT EXAMPLES

Washfield Wetland

Supporting the start-up costs of the ambitious new wetland site – a collaboration of local farmers and landowners creating a haven for wildlife in Mid Devon, to increase local biodiversity whilst improving river water quality, reducing soil run-off, and reducing flooding at key sites downstream in Tiverton.



Swift Boxes

Restoring Devon's Swift population to address the drastic decline in numbers over the last 25 years by installing nest boxes and audio lures into village church towers to attract breeding pairs and kickstart new colonies.

Native Kelp Resoration

Trialling 'Green Gravel' in Devon, a low-cost, scalable, practical method of kelp transplant to future-proof native kelp beds against climate change. Kelps offer multiple benefits, including nutrient recycling, carbon sequestration, and nursery & feeding grounds for marine life.







Plastic Free North Devon

Tackling plastic pollution, inspiring reconnection with nature, and facilitating sustainable behaviour change via community education, events, and campaigns to foster a healthier relationship between the people of North Devon and the natural world.



OUR PROJECT EXAMPLES

Wild About Devon

Providing a small grants fund to empower communities to take action for wildlife: creating new wildlife sites or changing the management of parks, gardens, churchyards, orchards, ponds, ditches, and buildings to benefit a wide range of wildlife species.

Crayfish Hatchery

Establishing a new hatchery & nursery for white-clawed crayfish to increase their population & prevent extinction. Helping this crucial native species will increase biodiversity, improve water quality, and restore freshwater ecosystems.

Regenerative Agriculture

Kick-starting a new School of Regenerative Land-Based Studies that offers practical training to fill a skills gap and grow the next generation of regenerative farmers - sequestering carbon & mitigating the effects of climate change.










Mycelium & Biochar

Trialling mycelium & biochar recipes to sequester carbon, enhance soil quality, and clean up river pollution via mycofiltration; identifying replicable low-cost, lowtech solutions that empower landowners and communities.



OUR PROJECT EXAMPLES

Pesticide-Free Bradley

Encouraging and supporting households across the ward of Bradley, Newton Abbot, to go pesticide-free with an ultimate aspiration to work with other local community groups to launch a Pesticide-Free Devon initiative.

Beaver Reintroductions

Exploring different landowner incentives to enable nature's engineers to re-populate Devon's waterways where they increase biodiversity & carbon sequestration, reduce flooding and soil erosion, and enhance water quality.

Peatland Restoration

Experimenting with ways to regenerate peatlands with the communities who live nearby, such as by growing sphagnum moss & transplanting it onto the moor to discover whether this practical approach can deliver tangible results at significant scale.









River Water Quality

Conducting year-round bacterial and chemical testing along the River Dart, working with SWW to drive infrastructure updates to restore water quality and river health., while engaging the community through a series of events and workshops.
